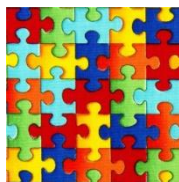

FREE CPR TRAINING

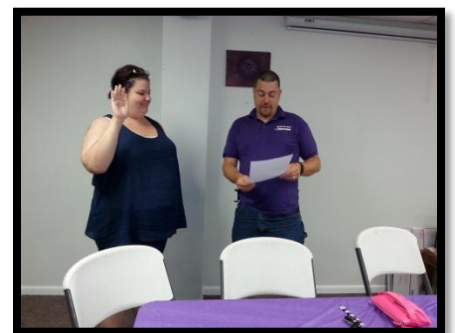

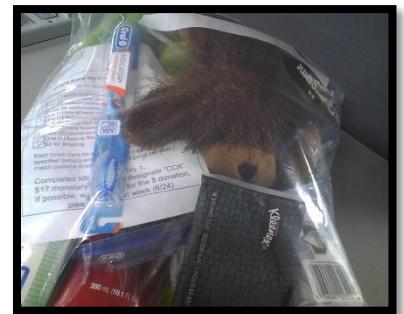

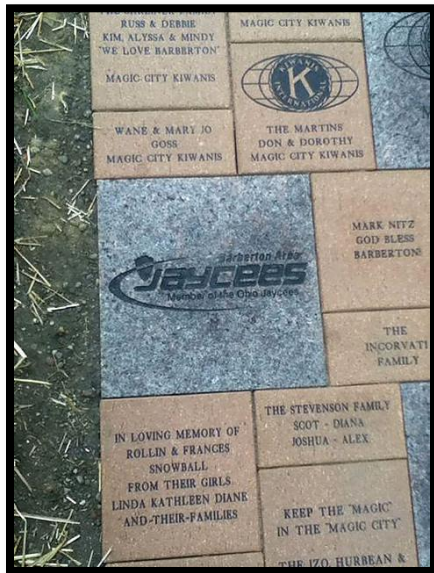
